WORLD CONSUMER RIGHTS DAY (18.04.2022)-



focus this year is on highlighting the importance of challenging biases and misconceptions to create a more inclusive and gender-equal world.

History

- ❖ International Women's Day was celebrated for the first time by the United Nations in 1975. Then in December 1977, the General Assembly adopted a resolution proclaiming a United Nations Day for Women's Rights and International Peace to be observed on any day of the year by Member States, in accordance with their historical and national traditions.
- ❖ However, International Women's Day (IWD) has at first been observed since the early 1900's- a time of great expansion and turbulence in the industrialized world that saw booming population growth and the rise of radical ideologies.
- ❖ It is the result of unrest and critical debate occurring amongst women which was Women's oppression and inequality was spurring women to become more vocal and active in campaigning for change. Then, in 1908, 15,000 women marched through New York City demanding shorter hours, better pay and voting rights.
- ❖ In accordance with a declaration by the Socialist Party of America, the first National Woman's Day (NWD) was observed across the United States on February 28. Women continued to celebrate NWD on the last Sunday of February until 1913.
- ❖ The UN announced their first annual theme "Celebrating the past, Planning for the Future" which was followed in 1997 with "Women at the Peace table", in 1998 with "Women and Human Rights", in 1999 with "World Free of Violence Against Women", and so on each year until the current.



Re-ignition of International Women's Day

- ❖ By the new millennium, there was little activity occurring for International Women's Day in most countries. The world had moved on and, in many spheres, feminism wasn't a popular topic. Something was needed to re-ignite International Women's Day giving it the respect it deserves and to raise awareness amongst the masses.
- ❖ The internationalwomensday.com platform was launched with the specific purpose of re-energizing the day - a focus which continues to this day - celebrating and making visible the achievements of women while continuing the call for accelerating gender parity.

❖ 2011 saw the 100-year centenary of International Women's Day - with the first IWD event held exactly 100 years ago in 1911 in Austria, Denmark, Germany and Switzerland.


❖ Since 2014, many efforts have been made by the Union Government to address women's issues in order to have a more holistic view of things. Government of India has sought to foster women empowerment in a comprehensive manner that deals with five components of women empowerment and security: health security of the mother and child, social security, financial security, security of the future through educational and financial programmes, and last but not the least, the physical safety of women. Through a slew of measures and initiatives such as Maternity Benefit

(Amendment) Bill 2017, Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan, Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana, National Nutrition Mission, Mission Indradhanush, Swachh Vidhyalaya Initiative, Swachh Bharat Mission, Triple Talaq Bill, Haj Without Mehram, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, Ujjwala Yojana, Pradhan Mantri MUDRA Yojana, Stand Up India, Sukanya Samridhhi Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, Death penalty to persons accused of heinous crime like rape, Anti-trafficking Bill amongst other initiatives have expanded the idea of women's security to a more comprehensive security paradigm, where they feel safe, secure and free to pursue their dreams in India.




Therefore, in the context of paving

the way for women, the Ministry of Women and Child Development has celebrated the International Women's Day week from 1st to 8th March 2022 as an 'Iconic Week' as a part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'.

As a part of the week-long celebration for International Women's Day, the Ministry has organized various events and social media campaigns covering a variety of themes related to women's safety and empowerment. The events have been organised in partnership with national and international organisations and experts, with active participation planned with women and children, as well as personnel who work directly for their protection and empowerment.

Women's Week Celebration as part of the 'Iconic Week' by WCD:



On March 1, 2022, the celebration kicked off in collaboration between WCD and Bureau of Police Research and Development to raise awareness on safety and security of women. On this day, the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) also celebrated its Foundation Day. The focus of the event was children, wherein an exhibition by children was displayed and children were taken on a guided tour of the Red Fort.

On March 2, 2022, WCD launched the Street Manoraksha Project in collaboration with NIMHANS Bengaluru. This project emphasised on the psychosocial well-being and aims to improve the mental health of women in India.

On March 3, 2022, the theme for the celebration was 'Women of Tomorrow'. There was a panel discussion on topics like Young Women in

STEM – Opportunities, Challenges and Solutions followed by #NariShaktiVarta Fireside Chat on financial literacy with the Union Minister of Women and Child Development.

On March 4 and 5, 2021 a two-day National Workshop with State Commissions for Protection of Child Rights (SCPCRs) on Contemporary issues pertaining to Child Rights was organised in Bhopal.

On 7th March 2022, 'Back to School' Campaign was launched as 'Kanya Shiksha Pravesh Utsav', focusing on supporting out-of-school girls.

On the final day, 8th March 2022, two major events – Nari Shakti Puraskaar and International Women's Day Conference for Women Police Delegates from all States/UTs were held. To know more, click [here](#).






Government Initiatives related to welfare of women

Government of India promotes social and economic empowerment of women through various policies and programmes, mainstreaming gender concerns, creating awareness about their rights and facilitating institutional and legislative support for enabling them realize their human rights and develop to their full potential. For effective implementation of various schemes and programmes of the Ministry of Women and Child Development, all major schemes of the Ministry have been classified under three umbrella schemes viz. Mission Poshan 2.0, Mission Vatsalya and Mission Shakti.

The details of major schemes and measures are²:

- Kanya Shiksha Pravesh Utsav Abhiyan is a collaborative initiative by the Ministry of Education & WCD launched i.e., March 8, 2022 to ensure more girls get the joys of education.
- Saksham Anganwadis are new generation anganwadis that have better infrastructure and audio-visual aids, powered by clean energy and providing improved environment for early child development.
- Mission POSHAN 2.0 is an Integrated Nutrition Support Programme. It seeks to address the challenges of malnutrition in children, adolescent girls, pregnant women and lactating mothers through a strategic shift in nutrition content and delivery and by creation of a convergent eco-system to develop and promote practices that nurture

health, wellness and immunity. Poshan 2.0 seeks to optimize the quality and delivery of food under the Supplementary Nutrition Program.

- Mission Shakti envisages a unified citizen-centric lifecycle support for women through integrated care, safety, protection, rehabilitation and empowerment to unshackle women as they progress through various stages of their life. Mission Shakti has two sub-schemes 'Sambal' and 'Samarthya'. While the "Sambal" sub-scheme is for safety and security of women, the "Samarthya" sub-scheme is for empowerment of women.

The 'Samarthya' sub scheme is for empowerment of women, consisting of existing schemes of Ujjwala, Swadhār Greh and Working Women Hostel.

- Swadhār Greh scheme targets the women victims of unfortunate circumstances who are in need of institutional support for rehabilitation so that they could lead their life with dignity.
- Ujjawala is a comprehensive scheme to combat trafficking with the objective to prevent trafficking of women and children for commercial sexual exploitation, to facilitate rescue victims and placing them in safe custody, to provide rehabilitation services by providing basic amenities/needs, to facilitate reintegration of victims into the family and society, to facilitate repatriation of cross border victims.
- Working Women Hostel aims at providing safe and affordable accommodation to working women. These hostels have Day care facility for the children of inmates too. The Ministry provides financial support for establishing such hostels by NGOs or State Governments.
- In addition, the National Creche Scheme for children of working mothers and the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY), which have been under the Umbrella ICDS Scheme till now, are also subsumed in 'Samarthya'.

The 'Sambal' sub-scheme consists of the existing scheme of One Stop Centres (OSC), Women Helplines (181-WHL) and Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP).

- One Stop Centre (OSC) facilitates access to an integrated range of services including police, medical, legal, psychological support and temporary shelter to women affected by violence. The Scheme is funded through Nirbhaya Fund.
 - Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) scheme is a tri-ministerial initiative of Ministries of Women and Child Development, Health & Family Welfare and Human Resource Development with a focus on awareness and advocacy campaign for changing mindsets, multi-sectoral action in select districts, enabling girls' education and effective enforcement of Pre-Conception & Pre Natal-Diagnostic Techniques (PC&PNDT) Act. The specific objectives of the scheme include preventing gender biased sex selective elimination; ensuring survival and protection of the girl child and ensuring education and participation of the girl child.
- **Mission Vatsalya** - Children have been recognized by policy makers as one of the supreme national assets. India is home to 472 million children up to the age of 18 years and comprise 39 per cent of the country's population.

The objectives of Mission Vatsalya are:

- To secure a healthy and happy childhood for every child in India
- Foster a sensitive, supportive and synchronized ecosystem for development of children;
- Assist States/UTs in delivering the mandate of the Juvenile Justice Act 2015;
- Achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Components under Mission Vatsalya will include statutory bodies; service delivery structures; institutional care/services; non-institutional community-based care; emergency outreach services; training and capacity building.

- WCD has also advised the States/UTs to increase the representation of women in the police force. 17 States/UTs have extended 33% or more reservation for women in police forces.
- Capacity Building of Elected Women Representatives (EWRs) to empower women to participate effectively in the governance processes were taken up during 2017-18 and 2018-19. 33,332 EWRs were trained across the country.
- "Mahila E-haat", is an online marketing platform for women entrepreneurs. Government has promoted platforms such as Government e-Market Place (GeM) and e-market place managed by National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) to support the entrepreneurs.



- Aatma Nirbhar Bharat campaign is linking the ability of women with the development of the country. This change is visible as about 70 per cent beneficiaries of Mudra Yojna are women. The country has seen a three-fold increase in the number of women self-help groups in the last 6-7 years. Similarly, in more than 60 thousand Startups that have emerged after 2016, 45 percent have at least one woman director.

- Participation of women in the growth cycle of new India is increasing relentlessly. Women's Commissions should work to promote and give maximum recognition to this role of women in the



society. Since 2015, 185 women have been honoured with Padma Awards. This year too, 34 women figured among the awardees in different categories. This is a record as this many awards to women are unprecedented.

- The policies of the country have become more sensitive towards women. Today India is among the countries with provision of maximum days maternity leave. To ensure that marriage at an early age does not hinder the education and career of daughters, the age of marriage for daughters is being raised to 21 years.
- Govt initiatives such as 9 crore gas connections and toilets, Pucca houses of PM Awaas Yojna in the name of women of the house, support during pregnancy, Jan Dhan accounts, that make these women the face of changing India and lead to women empowerment.

Women at the forefront tackling COVID pandemic

It is a matter of great pride that Indian women continue to contribute and lead in the sphere of global health as well. The toughest challenges that humanity faced during COVID pandemic times, women across the world played the role of saviours with great élan. It has only reconfirmed an established fact that when women are empowered and placed on the frontline, history is created. In fact,

2020 which I have often called as the Year of Science, and which has helped us combat this dreaded disease, has its fair share of women scientists that have furthered the cause.



Gender, Culture and Society: A Look from Tribal community Perspective

Introduction

- Indian society is very old, complex or plural by nature.
- The contemporary India carries co-existence of different social evolutions like hunting, gathering, shifting cultivator, nomad, trader, artisan, settled agriculturist, industrial worker, wage labourer etc.
- It is also a country with a small but meaningful tribal population.
- The religions and faith groups like Hinduism, Christianity, Islam, Buddhists of the world are also found in India. The composite culture of India has provided a pattern of pluralism.

Some conceptual issues

- gender- The state of being male or female in cultural or social context. Sex tend to refer to a biological differences, while Gender tends to refer to culture or social ones.
- Society- It is a largest permanent group in which individuals have common interests, common territory and common mode of life.
Culture –It is a symbiotic and learned aspect of human society and is socially rather than biologically transmitted. E.B Tylor define (1871) 'culture is commonly used as a complex whole which includes knowledge, belief, art, morals, law and customs. It includes both material and non-material aspects of culture, transmitted by teaching and tradition.

Tribal women contd....

- Till date social scientists largely believe that all the societies are male dominated, while anthropologists particularly argued that hunting- gathering and horticultural societies were based on egalitarian principles (Sacks, 1979, Sanday lbid).
- As regard the **status of tribal women**:
one interpretation propagate that **tribal women enjoy** their socio, economic, political and cultural rights in their society.
The **second perspective** looks at the status of tribal women from constitutional safeguards and measures, guaranteeing human rights and mutual respect (Xaxa,2004,2009)

Thus, it is observed that very little recognition has been given by the State to customary law and women rights over land, knowing the fact very well that

"Women constitute half the world's population, contributes nearly two-thirds of its total hours in household and economic activities of the family, receive one-tenth of the world's income and less than one hundredth of the property."
(The United Nation's Report in 1980)

Social justice demands that a woman should be treated equally both in the economic and the social sphere. The exclusion of daughters from participating in property ownership (in operation) merely by reason of their sex is unjust.
(174th LAW COMMISSION REPORT)

Review of Literature

- In first half of 20th century the major works of women anthropologists like Margaret Mead (1928), and Ruth Benedict have produced extensive study-based documents on Polynesians and native Americans on women issues largely influenced by culture and not only by biology as previously believed .
- The western feminist looked at anthropology to understand women's situation in different social, political and economic orders, causes of subordination in a much broader perspective.
- Anthropology has contributed (Moore,1994:10), that gender is socially constructed rather than a naturally given category.
- Anthropologists build the theory that women are allocated with nature and men with culture (Ortner,1974), and women are linked to the domestic sphere as opposed to men linked with the public sphere (Rosaldo,1980).

Inheritance of properties among Hindus and Muslims

- Among the Hindus Under Mitakshara school women as incoming wives were only entitled to maintenance and unmarried daughters, entitled to marriage expenses and gifts.
- Bombay (Mayukha) sub-school of Mitakhara allowed an absolute estate to the daughter (unmarried one or returns when she became widow)
- *Dayabhaga school* recognises the widow and her daughters as heirs over ancestral estate.
- Among the Muslim daughters and widows inherit property: daughter's share is half that of a son, and a widow could only receive one-fourth of her husbands estate if child less or one- eighth if there was a child or a son's descendants.

State Policies on Land in Odisha: and the status of customary practices of Tribal Women

- The Orissa (Scheduled Areas) Transfer of Immovable Properties (by Scheduled Tribes) Regulations, 2 of 1956 as amended in 2002.
- Orissa (Scheduled Areas) Money Lenders Regulation, 1967 as amended in 2001.
- Section 22 and 23 of Orissa Land Reforms Act, 1960
- The OLRA 1960, the gender inequalities are very much clear. The Act does not mention the order of the devolution at all. Married daughters are exempted from the inheritance. The men subsumes women's rights. Husbands were not taking permission from the wife for the dealing of land.
- In post 1970 period attempts are being made to bring women as the coparceners on land rights, but yet to be succeeded.

Cont...

- Orissa Prevention of Land Encroachment Act, 1972
- Policy to tackle the problems of Pre-1980 and post-1980 Forest Encroachments and declaration of forest villages as revenue villages.
- Land donations under Bhoodan
- Policy on Rehabilitation of Tribals (R&R Policy 2006) affected by construction of irrigation projects or establishment of industries etc.
- Mo Jami – Mo Diha' (My land – My homestead) campaign.
- Vasundhara
- Land distribution under Forest Rights Act (FRA)
- Under the Joint Patta Holding (GoO 2000) the Ceiling Surplus of Govt land is to be distributed in the name of both wife and husband.
- Women are the coparceners when the land being given either for the homestead or for the agriculture purposes and at least 40 per cent of the Govt land should go to the hands of women.

SUPREME COURT ORDER ON TRIBAL WOMAN PROPERTY RIGHT

- In Madhu Kishwar & others vs. State of Bihar & others (1996) 5 SCC 125)
The Court declined to be persuaded by the argument that giving the women rights in property would lead to fragmentation of lands:
- It recommended that 'Right to property of the tribal women's means the right to livelihood of the family'.
- Accordingly it was held that the tribal women would succeed to the estate of their parent, brother, husband as heirs by succession and inherit the property with equal share with male heir with absolute rights as per the general principles of Hindu Succession Act, 1956, as amended and interpreted by the Court and equally of the Indian Succession Act to tribal Christian.


- Why women in tribal community enjoy greater respect in their socio-cultural life?







What is Maternal Mortality?

- ▢ Maternal Mortality is the death of a woman while pregnant or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy, irrespective of the duration and site of the pregnancy, from any cause related to or aggravated by the pregnancy or its management but not from accidental or incidental causes - WHO
- ▶ Late Maternal death: A late maternal death is defined as the death of a woman from direct or indirect obstetric causes, more than 42 days but less than one year after termination of pregnancy.
- ▢ Maternal Mortality Ratio (Indicator to know the status of Maternal Mortality)
 - ▶ The maternal mortality ratio (MMR) is defined as the number of maternal deaths during a given time period per 100,000 live births during the same time period.
 - ▶ $MMR = (\text{Number of maternal deaths} / \text{Number of live births}) \times 100,000$

MATERNAL MORTALITY IN INDIA: Causes and Measures

BIBHABARI BAL

CAUSES

- ▶ In India, the major complications that account for nearly 2/3rd of all maternal deaths are,
 - Pregnancy-related complications (main cause of death among girls between 15 and 19 yrs)
 - high BP during pregnancy
 - complications from delivery and unsafe abortions
 - severe bleeding (mostly bleeding after childbirth),
 - infections (usually after childbirth),
- ▶ The major causes of maternal deaths in Odisha include
 - complications during delivery,
 - postpartum infection and
 - unsafe abortions

PRESENT SCENARIO

- ▶ The global maternal mortality ratio decreased by 38% - from 342 deaths to 214 deaths per 1,00,000 live births.
 - UNICEF, from 2000 to 2017
- ▶ 94% of all maternal deaths occur in low and lower middle-income countries.
- ▶ Young adolescents (ages 10-14) face a higher risk of complications and death as a result of pregnancy than other women.
 - WHO
- ▶ MMR has declined to 122 (2015-17) in comparison to 301(2001-2003)
 - Health And Family Welfare Statistics Report(2019-20)
- ▶ Assam (215), UP (197), AP (173), Rajasthan (164), Chhattisgarh (159), Odisha (150), Bihar (149), and Uttarakhand (99).
- ▶ The southern States registered a lower MMR - Karnataka (92), AP (65), Telangana (63), Tamil Nadu (60) and Kerala (43).
 - Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, 2020

iv) High Incidence/Prevalence of Reproductive tract Infections (RTI) Sexually transmitted Infections (STI)

- ▶ About 6% of adults have one or the other RTI/STI.
- ▶ STI and RTI have also impact on infertility, still births, neonatal deaths and maternal deaths.
- ▶ Persons with RTI/STI are at risk of acquiring and transmitting HIV.
- v) Unsafe Abortions
 - ▶ Nearly 13% of maternal mortality is on account of unsafe abortions in India.
 - ▶ Though termination of pregnancy is legal in India by MTP Act, illegal abortions are rampant.
- vi) Inadequate Post-natal Care
 - ▶ Nearly 80% of deliveries are institutional in India. However, over 70% of mothers stay less than 24 hours at institution after delivery and hence not getting enough care at home after delivery.
 - ▶ Nearly 62% of mothers received post-natal care with 2 days of delivery from a doctor/nurse/LHV/ANM and other health personnel.
 - ▶ Only 36.4% received financial assistance under JSY.

Socio-Economic Causes of Maternal mortality:

i) Malnutrition in women and adolescent girls

- ▶ Over 50% of Antenatal women are anemic.
- ▶ 23% of women have low BMI which is an evidence of chronic energy deficiency (16%) -NFHS - 4 (2013-16)
- ▶ The proportion of such women is higher in rural areas (27%) than in urban areas
- As a result,
 - ▶ anemic women give births to low birth weight babies.
 - ▶ Women's work capacity goes down and the risk of hemorrhages after delivery and various infections increases.
- ▶ The average intake of calories is substantially below the recommended dietary allowances for women in India especially among, adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating mothers - NNMB survey
- ▶ So, dietary intake of a rural woman should be more than urban women as they spend more energy in daily household chores and also remain engaged in agriculture.

vii) Poor Environmental Condition and Poor Health Infrastructure

- ▶ Lack of safe drinking water & pure air, unclean sanitation, open defecation are still prominent.
- ▶ Only 58.6% of antenatal mothers have antenatal check-up during first trimester.
- ▶ consuming IFA tablets for 100 days or more were 30% and only 21% of women had full antenatal care (minimum 4 Antenatal check-ups, at least one tetanus toxoid injection and IFA tablets taken for 100 or more days is necessary).

viii) Male Preference causing female foeticide

- ▶ 933 women per 1000 men in India mean over 37 million female are missing in India.
- ▶ Son preference causes female foeticide and infanticide, high maternal mortality

ii) Early marriages and teen-age pregnancies

- ▶ About 22% - 26.8% of girls get married below the age of 18 years.
- ▶ Early marriages lead to teen-age pregnancies which are risky pregnancies with a 30% increased risk of still births and neo-natal death.
- ▶ Nearly 8% of births in India occurred in teen age group (NFHS-4).
- ▶ Anaemia is widely prevalent among rural adolescent girls in India. So, a pregnancy at this stage is a high-risk pregnancy with abnormal conception and prolonged labour.

iii) High Fertility and Repeated Pregnancy

- ▶ Total Fertility has declined to 2.2. However, crude birth rate is high in rural areas and in states like U.P., Bihar, Rajasthan and M.P.
- ▶ Infant mortality and maternal mortality are also high in these states and couples are not sure of survival of their children, hence give birth to more children in the process.
- ▶ High risk of maternal mortality in case of,
 - > mothers whose age are either below 20 or above 30 years,
 - > Birth intervals are less than two years, and
 - > who have more than 3 children in short duration experience

ix) Female Illiteracy and Poverty

- ▶ Nearly 30% of women are illiterate with less information and less health knowledge.
 - ▶ Due to Poverty People cannot afford quality health services to save maternal health
- ### x) Cultural apathy to Women's health
- ▶ Women are expected not to bother about their health. Moreover, they are expected to eat last after serving to all and it is also applicable to a pregnant woman.
 - ▶ They are socialized to sacrifice their needs and desires in favour of their family members. But the needs and nutritional requirements of a woman particularly a pregnant woman is hardly attended by family members.
 - ▶ Ignorance along with poverty and cultural taboos results in poor health, gynecological and obstetrics related ailments among pregnant women and lactating mothers.

Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY)

- ▶ It is implemented by the MWCD since 1st January 2017 in all districts of the state.
- ▶ The objective of the PMMVY is to give partial compensation to pregnant women and lactating mothers who were working and had to experience a wage-loss due to the pregnancy.
- ▶ Under this Maternity Benefit Program, the beneficiaries would receive Rs 5,000 in 3 instalments on fulfilling certain conditions and, the cash benefits would be directly transferred to the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.
- ▶ The eligible beneficiaries would receive the incentive given under the Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY) for institutional delivery

Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan (PMSMA)

- ▶ PMSMA was launched in 2016 to improve the quality and coverage of Antenatal Care (ANC) including diagnostics and counselling services as part of the Reproductive Maternal Neonatal Child and Adolescent Health (RMNCH-A) Strategy.
- ▶ PMSMA guarantees a minimum package of antenatal care services to women in their 2nd & 3rd trimesters of pregnancy at designated government health facilities

MEASURES & PREVENTION

- ▶ Main focus of the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDG - Goal 3) is towards maternal and child health.
- ### Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY)
- ▶ This scheme is completely sponsored by the Government of India and comes under the National Health Mission since 1995.
 - ▶ JSY has the provision of cash assistance at the time of delivery and also during post-delivery care.
 - ▶ The role of The Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) is very crucial in the scheme.
 - ▶ Emergency services are provided at CHCs or Referral Units. In case of non-availability of the specialists in the Govt. centers, financial assistance up to Rs. 1500/- is provided to the pregnant woman for surgery at any Government/private hospitals or nursing home.

Conclusion

- ▶ India's current progress in reducing the MMR puts the country on track towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goal target of an MMR below 70 by 2030.
- ▶ Yet, India still has several drawbacks when it comes to accessibility to quality public health services. If these issues are addressed, India's MMR can be improved than before.
- ▶ **Skilled care before, during and after childbirth** can save the lives of women and newborns.

Rashtriya Kishor Swasthya Karyakram (RKSK)

- ▶ This is one of the strategic programmes to improve health and awareness of the adolescent girls and avoid future threats to safe motherhood. It includes Menstrual Hygiene Scheme, Peer Education (PE) Programme with the following objectives:
 1. to increase the awareness and access to information about adolescent health,
 2. to make provision of counselling and health services,
 3. to make provision of specific services such as sanitary napkins, iron and folic acid supplementation.

LaQshya - Labour Room Quality Improvement Initiative

- ▶ This program focuses on Public Health facilities to help at the time of delivery. It is assisted to improve the maternity operation theatres, and augment the quality of care in labour rooms.
- ▶ This program is implemented in all Community Health Centres (CHC), First Referral Unit (FRU), District Hospitals, Medical College Hospitals.


