This institution presently offers 14 UG programmes in three different streams.

College prepares an academic calendar for whole session on the basis of academic calendars given by DHE, Orissa and Utkal University. Accordingly, each faculty member prepares a lesson plan and progress register. This process is regularly audited by the academic bursar and the head of the institution. To broaden the outlook of the students on higher education, research and competitive examinations, the college arranges extramural/state/national level seminars/webinars. It also organise career counseling program for the students. As all the programs include field projects, the students participate in such projects to improve their outlook towards research activities.

The teachers of this institution participate in various academic activities like various State/National/International level seminars and webinars, faculty development programmes, orientation programs, refresher courses and conduct of examination, valuation, preparation of questions of different examination of Universities/autonomous colleges. The percentage of Ph.D holders to the total teachers is nearly 25%. Presently five faculties are continuing their research works in different Universities. Most of the teachers have teaching experience of around twenty years.</p> <p>The institution adheres to a complete transparent mechanism during continuous internal examination and evaluation which improves the quality of teaching learning process. 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

MOTTO OF NSS UNITS OF PATTAMUNDAI COLLEGE




DIFFERENT ACTIVITIES ORGANISED BY NSS UNITS FOR THE SESSION 2021-2022
