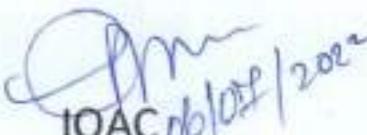

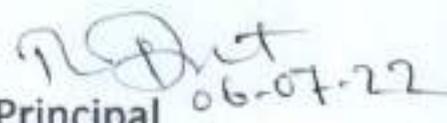

## Report of Analysis on Feedback Collected by different Stakeholders

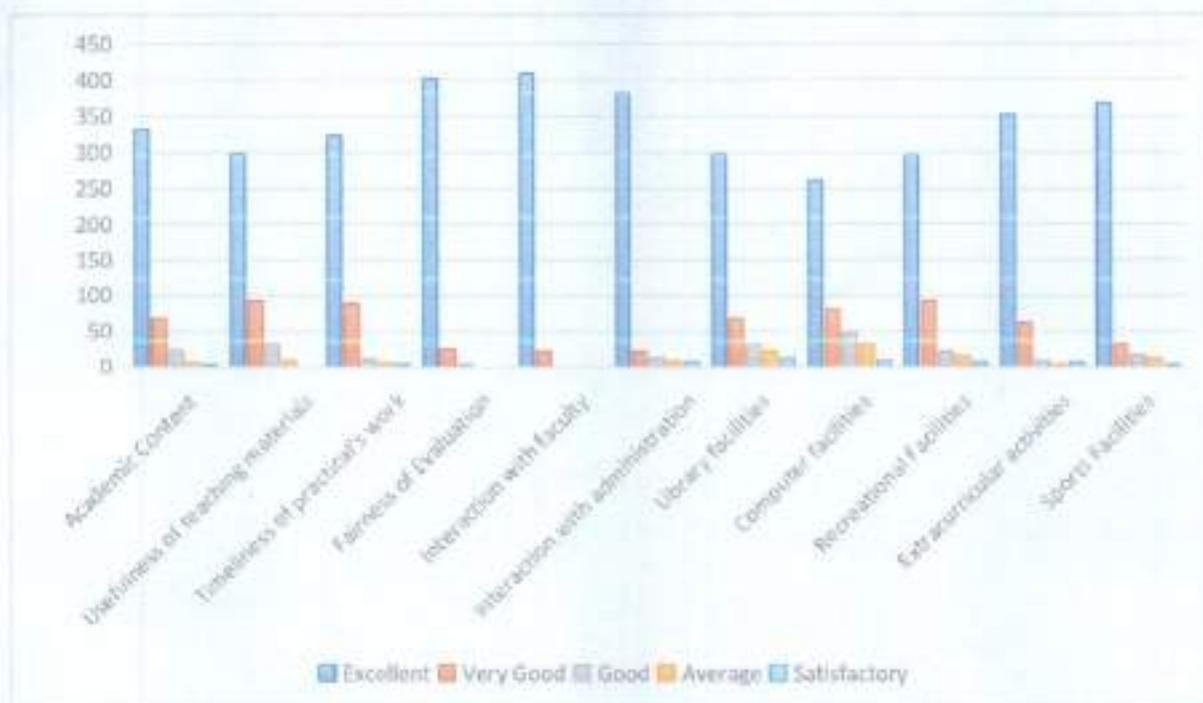
Academic Year: 2021-22

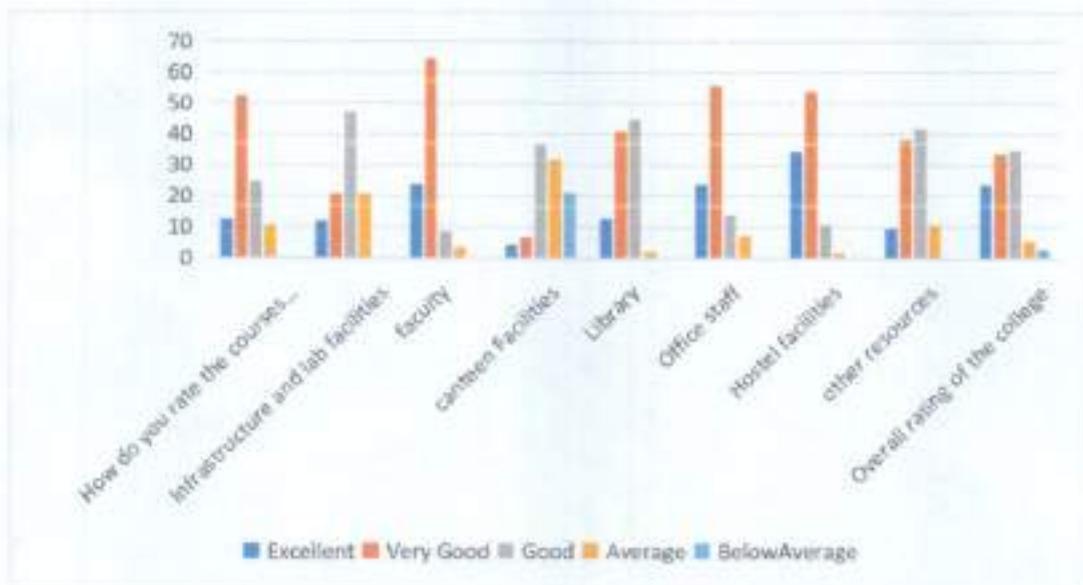
#### Alumni Feedback-

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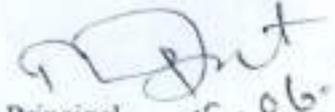

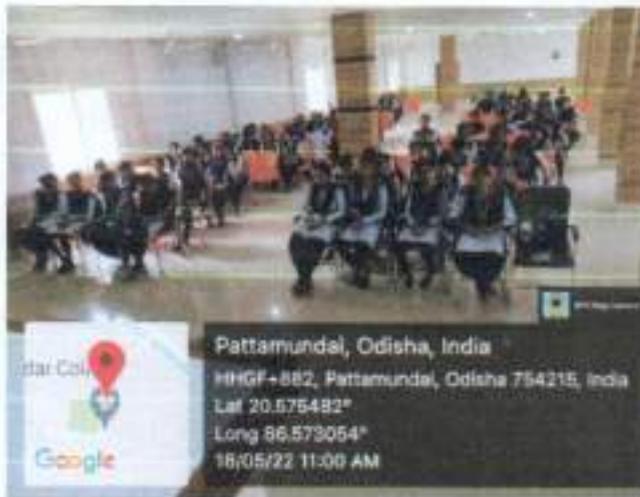
Most of the alumni rated the college a range of vary good to good indicating the college has adequate facilities in overall fields and needs a moderate change to cater the need of the students.

## Report

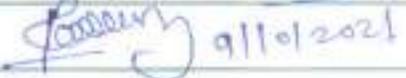
